On April 1, 2014, the Manitoba Gaming Control Commission (MGCC) and the Manitoba Liquor Control Commission's Regulatory Services Division will combine to become a single regulatory agency: the **Liquor and Gaming Authority of Manitoba (LGA)**.

What does this mean for First Nations VLT siteholders?

- VLT siteholder registrations will now be called VLT siteholder licences. This is a name change only. Your existing registration will be considered an LGA First Nations VLT siteholder licence and will remain in effect.
- The current First Nations VLT Siteholder Terms and Conditions will continue to apply to your licence. Compliance with these terms and conditions is required to maintain your licence in good standing. Inspectors will continue to monitor compliance as usual.
- Revised First Nations VLT siteholder reporting forms will be available at www.LGAmnitoba.ca on April 1. We will email revised electronic report files to your finance contact in April. Please continue to use the current MGCC forms until the revised forms are available.
- Minors are prohibited from playing VLTs or redeeming VLT payout vouchers under the new legislation. This change enshrines in legislation what has been a longstanding policy in Manitoba.
