On April 1, 2014, the Manitoba Gaming Control Commission (MGCC) and the Manitoba Liquor Control Commission's Regulatory Services Division will combine to become a single regulatory agency: the **Liquor and Gaming Authority of Manitoba (LGA)**.

What does this mean for gaming service providers?

- Effective April 1, the LGA will license gaming service providers under *The Liquor and Gaming Control Act*. You will be able to continue to do business as long as your licence is in good standing.
- Gaming management service registrations will now be called gaming service provider licences. This is a name change only. If you have an existing registration with the MGCC, it will be considered an LGA gaming service provider licence and will remain in effect until its expiry date.
- When you renew your registration, the LGA will issue a gaming service provider licence in place of a registration. There will be no change in the fees for this type of licence.
- Minor revisions have been made to terms and conditions for gaming service provider licences. The revised terms and conditions will be available at www.LGManitoba.ca on April 1. We will also send you a copy of the terms and conditions when they are available. The current MGCC terms and conditions will remain in force until April 1.
- Effective April 1, please make any gaming service provider fees payable to "LGA Manitoba".
